What Happens when Gummy Bears are Put in Liquids?

The second graders did an experiment to find out what would happen with gummy bears were put in different solutions. Their hypothesis was that they would dissolve.

Each student had 4 cups, each with a different liquid solution – salt/water, vinegar/water, baking soda/water and just water. They were very surprised by the results.

Instead of dissolving, the bears absorbed the liquids. They measured the bears to determine which liquids were absorbed more and which





were absorbed less. They gathered measurements of all the bears to get the range of measurements for the bears in each solution. The bears in water absorbed the most, growing to 2-3 cm wide and 2-3.5 cm high. The bears in salt absorbed the least, growing to only 1-1.5 cm wide and 2-3 cm high.

They also found it interesting to feel the different textures of the bears. Here are their descriptive words:

Salt – Slippery gooey, soggy Vinegar – jiggly, jello Water – soft, slimy, smooth Baking Soda – squishy, bubbles
