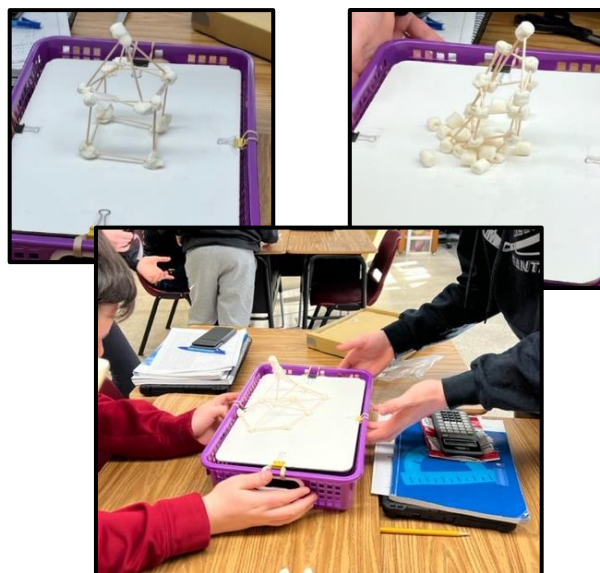

Natural Hazards. 6th and 8th grade Earth Science students are working on Natural Hazards. We looked at geological hazards including volcanoes, tsunamis, landslides, and earthquakes. We ended our study of earthquakes by building earthquake proof "buildings" and putting them on our shake table. They learned that it is important make sure your base is stable and putting more materials on the bottom will help the top stay stable as well. Also, using tape to anchor your building, rather than on the sides, makes it more stable as well.
