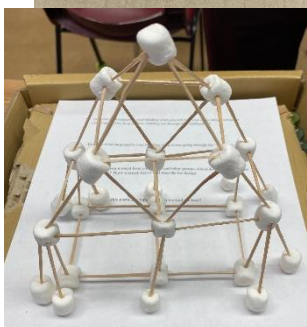
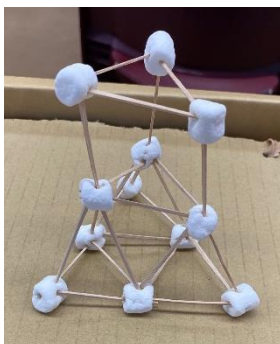
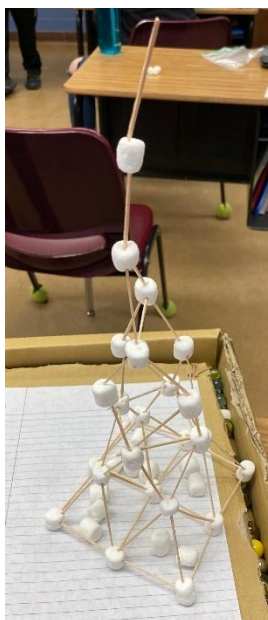
the largest number. Then they made that number in expanded notation.
