**WATER WELL PROJECT UPDATE...** The students voted to go BIG and give their chapel offerings toward a well for the students in Polar, Liberia, where students have to walk a half mile

to get clean drinking water. It takes \$3,000 to put in a well. To make this project a reality, we called on some extra resources. THANK YOU to our 9 sponsors who met the challenge of matching \$100 of the chapel money our students and staff brought in: HUEY'S FARM SEEDS, STEEL THE MOMENT PHOTOGRAPHY, TOBY'S SHOP, MALTERER FARMS, SUMMERS RIDGE VET CLINIC, CANNON RIDGE VET CLINIC, SAKATAH TRAIL RESORT, EL TORO BOWL and an ANONYMOUS SUPPORTER. The students and staff have brought in \$900! This, along with the \$900 from sponsors, \$137 from the sale of water bottles, \$75.60 from Sunday School, \$13.50 from Religion Release Classes and \$224 given at church for this cause, the total is \$2,250.35! AWESOME!!

Thank you to all the parents that sent supplies for our simple machine leprechaun traps. Each K-2<sup>nd</sup> classroom studied simple machines and built simple machine models in preparation for our final project on St. Patrick's Day. Students learned as much as they could about leprechauns. Then, they learned all about simple machines like wedges, pulleys, screws and other. In multi-grade level groups, students planned and built a leprechaun trap which included at least one simple machine.
