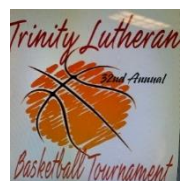
2021-2022 Enrollment Forms

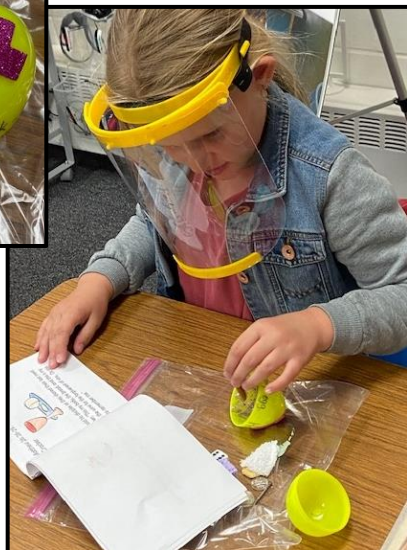


HOLY WEEK Our 2nd graders created a “Holy Week – I Can Share the Story Booklet,” along with a Holy Week



Egg which contained items to help them remember and share the Holy Week Story with others. Each page told a part of the story, and there was an item in the egg to go along with each page.

1. **Palm Branch.** Used as Jesus rode into Jerusalem.
2. **Cloth.** Jesus washed his disciple's feet to remind them to serve one another.
3. **Cracker.** Jesus told his disciples as they shared their last meal together, “This is my body, the bread, and this is my blood, the wine for forgiveness of sins. Do this often to remember me.”
4. **Dime.** Judas betrayed Jesus into the hands of the Jewish leaders for 30 pieces of silver.
5. **Purple Ribbon.** Jewish leaders put a scarlet robe and a crown of thorns on Jesus.
6. **Nail.** They nailed Jesus to the cross.
7. **Dice.** Roman soldiers used dice to gamble for Jesus' special robe.
8. **Sponge.** They put a sponge filled with vinegar on a stick and gave it to Jesus to drink when he was thirty.
9. **Rock/Cinnamon Stick.** When the women went to place spices on the body, they found that the stone had been rolled away.
10. **Empty Egg.** Jesus' tomb was empty. He had risen from the dead. Alleluia!
