This organization sends children to school in 3rd world countries and provides families with medicine, clean water, food, and animals. Heifer believes that ending poverty begins with agriculture. The mission of Heifer International is to end hunger and poverty while caring for the Earth. Heifer does this by providing appropriate livestock, training and related services to small-scale farmers and communities worldwide. They work with Cambodia, Ecuador, Ghana, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, India and Kenya.



In April, our focus is to collect for **Irrigation Pumps and Garden Seeds, with a goal of \$600**. This will pay for 2 Irrigation Pumps (\$150 each) and 5 Bundles of Garden Seeds (\$50 each). Clean water and food are items needed for people to survive. \$40.09 was received last week.
