#### NWEA Measures of Academic Progress® (MAP®)

Testing for grades K-8 will take place April 25-May 6.
The best way to prepare for MAP testing is to make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats breakfast.

Through this process, we will get a better idea of what the students know. This results in a rewarding experience for the student, and a wealth of detailed information for teachers, parents, and administrators.

MAP Testing presents students with engaging, ageappropriate content. As a student responds to questions, the test responds to the student, adjusting up or down in difficulty. As students answer a question correctly, they get a question of higher difficulty. If the students do not correctly answer the question, the next question will be a little lower in difficulty.



#### TLS Video Shoot - Wednesday, April 27

A video production crew will be here Wednesday, April 27, as we work on a new promotional video for our school. Zach Hagen (former TLS student and now owner

of Hagen Creative) will be capturing footage of classroom interactions, chapel, play practice, recess, and a few staff/parent/student interviews, to showcase all the wonderful things at Trinity! He will edit footage to provide us with a polished video to use on our TLS website, as well as shorter videos to use on social media, at the beginning of area church services, and other areas to promote our school in an effort to build interest and increase enrollment.
