Last week I talked about being “All In” as a Christian. You notice that some people have no problem being fully committed to God, while for others the process seems to be slow and gradual. It reminded me of our summer vacations in North Carolina. We are blessed to be able to stay with friends that have a pool. Now this pool is not heated, you don’t need a heated pool in the south. But at times the pool water feels a little chilly when first getting in. There are two ways to try and get accustomed to the pool temperature. The first way, done by my children and the owner of the house, is to just jump into the deep end and be fully submerged. It is quick and you get over any shock of the water temperature quickly. The second way is to ease yourself in, gradually go in deeper and deeper. This takes time and sometimes you just stop at a certain depth, not wanting to subject anymore of your body to the water temperature. I think this is a great analogy for committing ourselves to God and doing his work. Some just jump right in and submit themselves to God’s law and God’s will for their lives. Others go slowly not really willing to take the full plunge. What is it that keeps them from committing? I am not sure, and it is probably different for everyone. 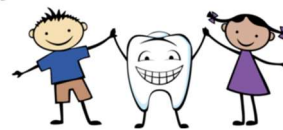
