Although our K-3 students did not get to visit the Janesville Fire Department last week during Fire Prevention Week, here is information to help keep your family safe.

This year's FPW campaign, "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen! "Works to educate everyone about the simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves, and those around them, safe in the kitchen.

Did you know? Cooking is the #1 cause of home fires and home fire injuries. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of fires in the kitchen. Here are safety tips to keep you from having a cooking fire.

- Never leave cooking food unattended. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling or broiling. If you have to leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.
- Remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you're cooking.
- You have to be alert when cooking. You won't be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine or drugs, or consumed alcohol that makes you drowsy.
- Always keep an oven mitt and pan lid nearby. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan to smother the flame. Turn off the burner, and leave the pan covered until it is completely cool.
- Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

People tend to underestimate their risk to fire, particularly at home. <u>Advance planning can make a potentially life-saving difference.</u>

A home escape plan includes

- Working smoke alarms on every level of the home, in every bedroom, and near all sleeping areas
- Two ways out of every room, usually a door and a window, with a clear path to an <u>outside meeting</u> <u>place</u> (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) that's a safe distance from the home
- Practice twice a year by all members of the home
