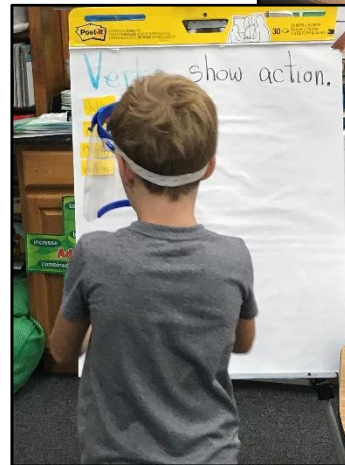

The purpose of Trinity Lutheran School is to equip the child to grow and serve as a disciple of Jesus Christ.



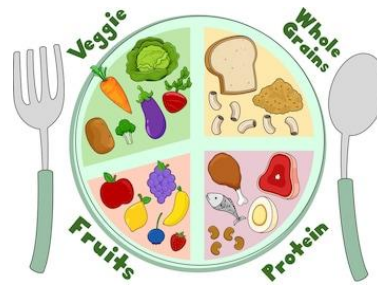
