



Cold Weather Clothing

child's teacher know so they can plan accordingly.

What to wear when the weather turns cold? Here are the guidelines we use to determine what the students should wear outside. Be advised that we are very firm on these rules, so please make sure that your child has the appropriate clothing that is needed.



Below 55, they need long sleeves.

Below 50, they need a sweatshirt or jacket.

Below 45, they need a winter coat, head covering (hat, headband or earmuffs, NOT just a hood), and gloves or mittens. If they do not have the correct type of coat, or head covering, they will need to borrow from someone else, or use something from the Lost and Found. We do not have kids stay inside unless they are sick.

To play in the snow, they **must** also have snow pants and boots. They will need to stand on the sidewalk if they do not have either of these items.

If it is **muddy** outside, we will require the students to wear boots, even if there is no snow. This is to make sure we don't track a lot of dirt into the classrooms.

SLEDS that are soft/foam or roll up may be brought and left at school.

EVERYONE should have a <u>pair of tennis shoes that stays</u> <u>at school</u> for gym class and if they forget their shoes.

Thanks to our 7th and 8th graders and to the Janesville Rotary Club, about two miles of the ditches along Highway 14 were cleaned up on October 14. This has been a great ongoing community service project in the fall and spring, with Rotary members leading our students along the ditches to clean up debris left by passing motorists.


Fall Harvest Parties for grade K-4 will take place on


Friday, November 5. Each teacher will let you know any important details. Students will not be dressing in costume but will play games and have treats to eat.
