also Reformation Day, a time to remember the 95 Theses Luther posted on the door of the church in Wittenberg. Luther posted these to point out things the church was doing wrong in the hopes that the church would look at them and change their practice. It made me think, if God were to post theses on your heart of the things you need to correct, what would they be? Maybe they would include the following:

- Put God first in your life, your work and fun can wait.
- Remember the Sabbath was made to worship me, not for you to worship other things.
- Read your bible, that is one way I can talk with you.

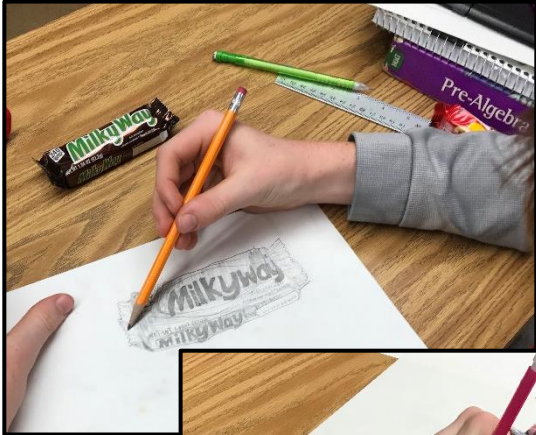

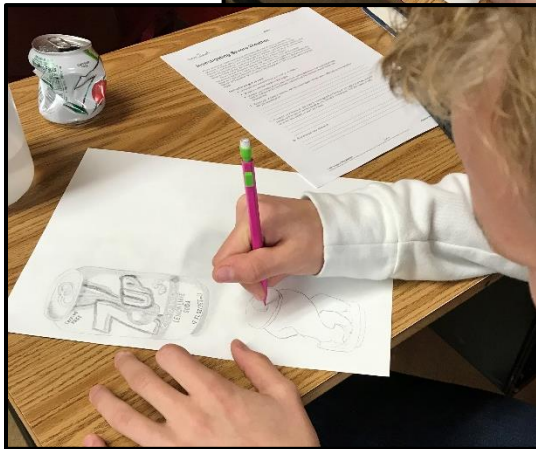
