It is almost Christmas. After school is over tomorrow, we begin our Christmas vacation. Just as Mary pondered the events of Christmas, I would like to take a moment to reflect on the events that have taken place since the beginning of this school year.

Our enrollment is 23 students more than it was last year. Praise God that 23 more students get to hear about Jesus each and every day. We were able to hold our Fun Run with all classes in attendance and raised more money than we had in the previous 11 years of the Fun Run. This was \$6578 more than we raised last year.

We started a preschool wraparound program which has allowed children to attend our program that might not have been able to in the past. We received a grant from Waseca County to hire a staff person to help with the safety protocols we had to put in place for this school year.

We received grants from the Janesville Area Foundation and the Rosenau Legacy of Angels for a balance beam for our playground, flexible seating for our Kindergarten classroom, new games and equipment for our school aged care program, and money for a green screen for recording videos and inserting backgrounds.



Things have been different this year and not always easy, but God continues to bless us in so many ways.
