1<sup>st</sup> place 6<sup>th</sup> grade – 36.5 avg points per student 2<sup>nd</sup> place 4<sup>th</sup> grade – 25.9 avg points per student 3<sup>rd</sup> place 5<sup>th</sup> grade – 23.7 avg points per student 4<sup>th</sup> place 2<sup>nd</sup> grade – 15.7 avg points per student 5<sup>th</sup> place 8<sup>th</sup> grade – 14.5 avg points per student 6<sup>th</sup> place 7<sup>th</sup> grade – 9.3 avg points per student 7<sup>th</sup> place 3<sup>rd</sup> grade – 7.6 avg points per student 8<sup>th</sup> place 1<sup>st</sup> grade – 1.3 avg points per student
