Discuss in your home or small group:

• What do you know about your own baptism or recall about a baptism you have seen?

- At his baptism, Jesus hears God's love and approval. How is that important to Jesus' future work?
- How does God's love and approval announced in your baptism guide your life of faith?



Read: Matthew 4:1-11.

Immediately after Jesus' baptism, he is led out into the desert to be tempted by the devil. What does the story of Jesus' temptation say about the importance of his baptism? Reflect on or talk about how baptism impacts one's daily life and struggles. Conclude by praying.

Pray: Merciful God, we thank you for Jesus' baptism and your naming him as your beloved with whom you are well pleased. Come Holy Spirit, strengthen all your baptized children, and lead us into your world with courage and peace to do your will, through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

SERVICE

In Isaiah 42:1-9, God's servant is chosen, loved, and strengthened with God's Spirit to bring justice to the world that includes a gentle strength that brings healing, freedom, and hope to others. Prayerfully reflect on how you can be a servant of God's love to another person. This next week commit to do some act of service as a beloved child of God.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Share in a ritual of baptismal remembrance at mealtime this week. Place a bowl of water in the center of your table. Dip a finger in the water and make the sign of the cross on your own forehead or that of another person. Say these words as you mark the sign of the cross.

"[Name], you are a beloved child of God marked with the cross of Christ forever. Amen."
